

Government Resource Planning (GRP) for Open Government

Situation

Government fiscal transparency provides numerous benefits including improved:

- citizen and business trust leading to increased remittances, enhanced internal and foreign investments, improved credit ratings, and reduced migration
- coordination with Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and Development Finance Institutions (DFIs), including the use of country systems
- Open Budget Index and Public Expenditure and Financial Accountability (PEFA) assessments

Complication

Fiscal open government can be supported via Financial Management Information Systems¹ (FMIS), however, few governments appear to have this facility, according to recent World Bank data².

Available fiscal information is often provided through structured PDF reports rather than via more useful open data.




Question

How can governments leverage FMIS environments to automate the production of open government fiscal data?

Solution
